What is Python?


- ▶ Multi-paradigm high-level programming language
- ▶ Technical details:
 - interpreted
 - dynamically typed
 - automatic memory management



- ▶ Advantages
 - Minimalistic syntax
 - Expressive language
 - Large standard library
 - Well documented
- } ▶ reduced development time for prototypes
▶ easy to maintain

Python for scientific computing

- ▶ Large scientific community
- ▶ Many libraries available
- ▶ Simple integration of optimized code written in compiled languages
- ▶ No license costs

▶ What is nipy?


A neuroimaging community maintaining several python libraries/packages
