




Scene Graph




Rendering = Traversal of the Scene Graph





Righthanded Rotations

- Around z: $x \rightarrow y$




- Around x: $y \rightarrow z$



- Around y: $z \rightarrow x$

X-y-z-x-Y-z-x-y-Z-x-y-z



2D Transformations

- Translation:

$$x_w = x_o + t_x$$

$$y_w = y_o + t_y$$

- Scaling:



$$x_w = s_x * x_o$$

$$y_w = s_y * y_o$$

- Rotation:

$$x_w = \cos \theta x_o - \sin \theta y_o$$

$$y_w = \sin \theta x_o + \cos \theta y_o$$



θ	0	30	45	60	90
sin	0.0	0.5	0.7071	0.8660	1.0
cos	1.0	0.8660	0.7071	0.5	0.0

2D Transformations Using Homogeneous Coordinates

- Translation:

$$\begin{bmatrix} 1 & 0 & t_x \\ 0 & 1 & t_y \\ 0 & 0 & 1 \end{bmatrix} \cdot \begin{bmatrix} x \\ y \\ w \end{bmatrix} = \begin{bmatrix} x + wt_x \\ y + wt_y \\ w \end{bmatrix}$$

- Scaling:

$$\begin{bmatrix} s_x & 0 & 0 \\ 0 & s_y & 0 \\ 0 & 0 & 1 \end{bmatrix} \cdot \begin{bmatrix} x \\ y \\ w \end{bmatrix} = \begin{bmatrix} s_x x \\ s_y y \\ w \end{bmatrix}$$

- Rotation:

$$\begin{bmatrix} \cos \theta & -\sin \theta & 0 \\ \sin \theta & \cos \theta & 0 \\ 0 & 0 & 1 \end{bmatrix} \cdot \begin{bmatrix} x \\ y \\ w \end{bmatrix} = \begin{bmatrix} \cos \theta x - \sin \theta y \\ \sin \theta x + \cos \theta y \\ w \end{bmatrix}$$

3D Transformations Using Homogeneous Coordinates

- Translation: `glTranslate* (tx, ty, tz)`

$$\begin{bmatrix} 1 & 0 & 0 & t_x \\ 0 & 1 & 0 & t_y \\ 0 & 0 & 1 & t_z \\ 0 & 0 & 0 & 1 \end{bmatrix} \bullet \begin{bmatrix} x \\ y \\ z \\ w \end{bmatrix} = \begin{bmatrix} x + wt_x \\ y + wt_y \\ z + wt_z \\ w \end{bmatrix}$$

- Scaling: `glScale* (sx, sy, sz)`

$$\begin{bmatrix} s_x & 0 & 0 & 0 \\ 0 & s_y & 0 & 0 \\ 0 & 0 & s_z & 0 \\ 0 & 0 & 0 & 1 \end{bmatrix} \bullet \begin{bmatrix} x \\ y \\ z \\ w \end{bmatrix} = \begin{bmatrix} s_x x \\ s_y y \\ s_z z \\ w \end{bmatrix}$$

3D Transformations Using Homogeneous Coordinates

- Rotation: `glRotate*(θ, ex, ey, ez)`

– around x

$$\begin{bmatrix} 1 & 0 & 0 & 0 \\ 0 & \cos \theta & -\sin \theta & 0 \\ 0 & \sin \theta & \cos \theta & 0 \\ 0 & 0 & 0 & 1 \end{bmatrix} \cdot \begin{bmatrix} x \\ y \\ z \\ w \end{bmatrix} = \begin{bmatrix} x \\ \cos \theta y - \sin \theta z \\ \sin \theta y + \cos \theta z \\ w \end{bmatrix}$$

– around y

$$\begin{bmatrix} \cos \theta & 0 & \sin \theta & 0 \\ 0 & 1 & 0 & 0 \\ -\sin \theta & 0 & \cos \theta & 0 \\ 0 & 0 & 0 & 1 \end{bmatrix} \cdot \begin{bmatrix} x \\ y \\ z \\ w \end{bmatrix} = \begin{bmatrix} \cos \theta x + \sin \theta z \\ y \\ -\sin \theta x + \cos \theta z \\ w \end{bmatrix}$$

– around z

$$\begin{bmatrix} \cos \theta & -\sin \theta & 0 & 0 \\ \sin \theta & \cos \theta & 0 & 0 \\ 0 & 0 & 1 & 0 \\ 0 & 0 & 0 & 1 \end{bmatrix} \cdot \begin{bmatrix} x \\ y \\ z \\ w \end{bmatrix} = \begin{bmatrix} \cos \theta x - \sin \theta y \\ \sin \theta x + \cos \theta y \\ z \\ w \end{bmatrix}$$

Composition of Transformations


- Initialize accumulative matrix C_0 with identity matrix I
- Post-multiply accumulative matrix C_i with transformation matrix M_i according to command. $C_{i+1} := C_i M_i$
- Accumulated result represents complete transformation (independent of the number of transformation steps)
- Transformation sequence not commutative!!!

Example: translate1 - scale1 - rotate1 - translate2 - rotate2

$$I * T_1 * S_1 * R_1 * T_2 * R_2 * \begin{bmatrix} x \\ y \\ z \\ w \end{bmatrix} = \begin{bmatrix} x' \\ y' \\ z' \\ w' \end{bmatrix}$$



Transformation Examples


```
// Flight Simulator, Pilot View (“fly-through”)
// world rotates around stationary camera
```

```

glRotated (roll, 0.0, 0.0, 1.0); // z      (4)
glRotated (pitch, 0.0, 1.0, 0.0); // y      (3)
glRotated (heading, 1.0, 0.0, 0.0); // x     (2)
glTranslated (-planex, -planey, -planez); (1)
```

```
// Polar View: rotating camera (= examine object)
```

```
// camera rotates around stationary object
```



glTranslated (0.0, 0.0, -distance);      (1)
glRotated (-twist, 0.0, 0.0, 1.0); // z    (2)
glRotated (-elevation, 1.0, 0.0, 0.0); // x (3)
glRotated (-azimuth, 0.0, 1.0, 0.0); // y   (4)
...

3D Projections


- Perspective Projection: `glFrustum*` (l,r,b,t,n,f)

$$\begin{bmatrix} \frac{2n}{r-l} & 0 & \frac{r+l}{r-l} & 0 \\ 0 & \frac{2n}{t-b} & \frac{t+b}{t-b} & 0 \\ 0 & 0 & \frac{-(f+n)}{f-n} & \frac{-2fn}{f-n} \\ 0 & 0 & -1 & 0 \end{bmatrix}$$




- Orthographic Projection: `glOrtho*` (l,r,b,t,n,f)

$$\begin{bmatrix} \frac{2}{r-l} & 0 & 0 & -\frac{r+l}{r-l} \\ 0 & \frac{2}{t-b} & 0 & -\frac{t+b}{t-b} \\ 0 & 0 & \frac{-2}{f-n} & -\frac{f+n}{f-n} \\ 0 & 0 & 0 & 1 \end{bmatrix}$$




Viewport Transformation

- `glViewport (x, y, width, height)`

// Viewing Transformations  
glMatrixMode (GL_MODELVIEW);  
glLoadIdentity ();  
glTranslatef (0.0, 0.0, -5.0); // move world away from camera  
glRotatef (45.0, 0.0, 1.0, 0.0); // rotate world in front of the camera around y-axis
